Cook Up Safety this Holiday Season

For many, the kitchen is the heart of the home. Whether it's to bake a pie or to cook an entire multi-course holiday meal for the entire family, this time of year kitchens across America are filled with a little extra warmth and cheer. Unfortunately, according to the Electrical Safety Foundation International, the kitchen is also where two of every five residential fires start.

This holiday season NOVEC urges members to take steps to protect their homes and families from cooking hazards:

- Never leave stovetops unattended. Turn off burners if you have to leave the room.
- ✓ Supervise children closely in the kitchen.
- Prevent fires by making sure your stovetop and oven are clean and free of grease and dust. Clean the exhaust hood and duct over the stove regularly.
- Keep the cooking area around the stove/oven clear of combustibles, such as towels, napkins, and pot holders.
- ✓ Wear short or close-fitting sleeves. Loose clothing can catch fire.
- To protect from spills and burns, use the back burners and turn the pot handles in, away from reaching hands.
- ✓ Locate all electric appliances away from the sink.
- ✓ Plug countertop appliances into Ground Fault Circuit Interrupter (GFCI)-protected outlets.
- Keep appliance cords away from hot surfaces including the range or toaster.
- Unplug the toaster and other small countertop appliances when not in use.
- ✓ *Be sure to turn off all appliances when cooking is completed.*

Recycle Holiday Greens

Once the holiday season is over, NOVEC will recycle greens at its Gainesville Technical Center, 5399 Wellington Branch Drive, Gainesville, VA 20155 near the Route 29 and Interstate 66 intersection, anytime from Dec. 26 to Jan. 9.



Co-op members may leave trees and other holiday greens in the

parking lot designated with orange safety cones. Greens must be free of all decorations, metal ornament hooks, wire, and light strings.

NOVEC tree crews will chop the greens into mulch. They will deliver mulch throughout the year to interested members at no charge when right-of-way crews are working in their neighborhoods. To request mulch, complete the form at www.novec.com/woodchips.

Tips of the Month: Energy Efficient Cooking

- Use small electric pans, toaster ovens or convection ovens for small meals rather than your stove or oven. A toaster or convection oven uses one-third to one-half as much energy as a full-sized oven.
- Use a covered kettle or pan or electric kettle to boil water; it's faster and uses less energy.
- 3) Match the size of the pan to the heating element.
