NOVEC's 2023 Annual Meeting was held Sept. 13 at NOVEC's Technical Center in Gainesville. More than 50 attending members heard from Board Chairman Wade House, and President and CEO Dave Schleicher.

Co-op members reelected Brent George to his District 2 seat on the Board of Directors.

During his state-of-the-Cooperative report, Schleicher said that NOVEC's most important job is to keep the lights on. In 2022, NOVEC maintained an outstanding 99.99% reliability rating. Schleicher also discussed a wide array of NOVEC services and programs. He provided an update on the Co-op's successful financial performance, and he explained how the utility industry as a whole is transforming.

OCTOBER IS NATIONAL CYBERSECURITY MONTH

NOVEC encourages Co-op members to take these precautions:

- 1. Create unique passwords with 10-12 characters that only you will remember. Use a combination of letters, numbers, and special characters. Keep them private. Change passwords every six months.
- 2. Keep all software up to date on internet-connected devices including personal computers, laptops, tablets, TVs, gaming devices, and smartphones.
- 3. Be careful when using wireless networks at public places such as airports and hotels. Don't access financial data or other sensitive information on these types of networks.
- 4. Don't click on links or attachments in emails or texts from unknown senders.
- 5. Log off of passwordconnected websites, especially those of your financial institutions, after visiting.
